To the Parents of the Students of
Excelsior Union High School

Dear Friends:

Beginning Monday, February 3rd, the bus regulations of the high school will be modified in one important respect and we wish to make you familiar with the change. We hope it will meet with your approval. Busses will continue to operate just as at present and the roll will be taken on each trip as at present, but it will no longer be compulsory for the student to ride the bus. That is, if he misses the bus or if you wish him to come some other way at any time, it will no longer be necessary for you to write a note or to call the school asking to have him excused for that particular trip.

It will still be necessary for each student who wishes the school to furnish him transportation to be assigned to a definite bus and he will have his regularly assigned seat. If the student is off the bus for any considerable number of trips, you will be notified. This notification will be entirely for your information so that if you are not satisfied with the way he is getting to school or from school to his home you may discuss it with him and may take whatever steps you see fit to have the situation remedied. If the student continues to be off the bus, his seat will be assigned to some other student and it will be necessary for you to arrange some other regular transportation for him.

If you wish your son or daughter to use some other means of transportation regularly, it will be necessary for you to sign a permit and have it on file at the school, just as at present.

The change outlined above has become necessary for a number of reasons. We wish to assure you that we have not taken this step hastily but have considered it from many different angles. We are vitally interested in the welfare of the children of our district and hope the change will help to eliminate some of the abuses which have grown up over the years. We also hope this change will be satisfactory to you.

If you have any questions or suggestions on this matter or on any other problem relating to the welfare of your son or daughter or to any part of his school work we would appreciate it greatly if you would get in touch with us for a conference just as soon as convenient to you.
