Dear Frank,

Got to Watts' office before nine, arranged these little before the judge, the stenographer came following in a few minutes later. The judge brought in the morning mail which was left outside the door. I remarked I could know that he received so many mails.

Bill said Watts. Oh, bills I said. But not whether he used to replace Watts. I guess not, I thought. Finally Watts got in touch with Merin over the phone. It was apparent that Merin was waiting for the money, too. But otherwise he (Merin) did not get in touch with the judge of the court appeal.

I told Watts, I wanted to speak to Merin. First thing he said was that he did not receive the money. I answered if they phoned and promised you'd be sure to get it later. I asked if he cannot come down to Cheyenne to attend to various matters. He replied it ^{was} necessary for him to come. Later we went to the bond co. and finally ~~got~~ received the thousand dollars

check which we took back and gave to Jim No. We had the file of election signed at that time also. ^(all the boys) The U.S. Marshall. He stated the order from Washington was to send the boys out following: older group to Seaworth and the younger group to McNeil's Island. ~~White~~ Brothers would not be separated he added.

I asked if one place was better than the other. No, he didn't see any difference, both of the places have prison farms. Baggage and personal belongings would not be needed informed the Marshall. Judge Watts paid the docket fee of three hundred and fifteen dollars to the Court Clerk. He went to see Judge Kennedy about bond but the judge told him to come back later as Pickett (U.S. attorney assist) wasn't in now. (Funny business, judge can't seem to decide by himself) I went back to jail and explained what the Marshall had said. They all decided to send their belongings home. We thought that was the best way. Mrs. Inasaki and her sister was already there (11:00 am). They helped making the lunches at the Japanese restaurant and had ^{already} brought the ben-tos to the boys.

We went back to jail afternoon and brought empty boxes and supplies for the necessary packing. The Marshall was at the jail giving list of names of the boys who were to go Monday to Leavenworth. I have the list of names on separate sheet. Frank, Judge Wath had found out about the bond from Kennedy. Three thousand dollars bond for each defendant. - - - -

We shall send the boys luggage & etc by express by Monday. Probably one bag or two may contain ~~some~~ belongings for the several boys so whoever receives it please see that it goes to the addressed families? Cash - purses - watches - pens - etc. I am keeping it shall take home personally.
