Dear Kubota,

Few days ago I received a letter from the fpc.fellows and I am very happy to know that the test case has begun and carrying on a legal proceeding at the metropolis of wyoming. The decision of a judge on the matter submitted in the trial will reflect the future of the americans.It does not matter what race, creed or color one might be.I understand the Billing Gazett is transmitting to the public and the news is fair affecting the direct trial.Maybe I will receive the Billing Gazett paper this afternoon?

As I wrote to you before that in this camp their is few half officials(self elected) person in this camp and at this time I want to inform to you three of them are in the critical condition in the hospital and just now I am told One chochin moche to the white trash died of hammar beating.I am very sorry that this had to happen to our color race and again It is the best that they vanish from present stage for the benefit of humanity. If my ^{Present} address change do not be alarm for the very reason I know what I am doing.

When you see Mr.Kuwahara will ^{You} express ^{that} I have acknowledgment ~~sent~~ his sincere gift.

Well, Mr. Kubota take good care of yourself and give my best regard to the rest of your family.
