"On February 16, 1993, the Board of Governors of the Japanese American Bar Association of Greater Los Angeles unanimously resolved to honor Frank Emi, Mits Koshiyama, Gloria Kubota and all of the courageous members of the Heart Mountain Fair Play Committee at today's community event.

"We do so in recognition of their courage and strength of conviction in asserting their fundamental constitutional rights. We honor you recognizing that you stood up for your civil rights, at the price of risking criminal convictions and, despite facing perhaps an even greater injury: ostracism from many in your own community.

"We recognize the Fair Play Committee for the true heroes that you were, and the important place you deserve in this community's and this country's history, as those who against all odds refused to compromise the constitutional rights, civil liberties, and human dignity which Japanese Americans and all people deserve.
