Dear Dad:

I received your letter several days ago and am glad to hear that you are in good health. It is good to hear that the appeal went thru all right. Mr. Wirin sounded cheerful although the chances for a favorable verdict are slim. As for the Appeal Court verdict you do not have to send it to me because I have a general idea how it is. Please do not enclose any copies or other communications as in your last letter because if it is not from an authorized correspondent I will not be able to receive it until a check has been made. You can write me explanations in your own letters. It is best not to mention names because I am not supposed to mention other inmates. That being one of the rules. They have to be strict about some things here but they treat us very well. I wish I could say as much for the concentration camps. We saw the show "Going My Way" starring Bing Crosby. It was a nice show. The weather has been nice here. I hear that the

weather around Heart Mt. is bad. Take very good care of yourself and tell Erick's dad to take good care of his health too. It is so easy to catch a cold or get sick. I work in a steam heated building and go to school part of the day. I am feeling fine and believe that I am making good use of my time.

Please give my regards to all of my friends. Guess you will have less friends when the Argishitas are gone.
