Curfew Denied Bail

PORTLAND, June 15. — (UP) — Minoru Yasui, 26 years old, American-born Japanese lawyer testing constitutionality of the Alien Curfew Law, today was refused release on bond from the county jail to go to a Japanese evacuation or relocation center. United States District Judge James A. Fee denied the bail.

Yasui, sentenced in November to one year's imprisonment and fined \$5,000, said he purportedly violated the curfew to bring a test case attacking validity of regulations affecting American-born Japanese. His conviction now is before the Supreme Court of the United States.
